Your ideal or desired resident: St Maureen's Sober Recovery House is a sober living residence for men who have recently graduated from a 28 day inpatient treatment program or probation/parole/MHMR clients who have 30 days of continuous, verifiable sobriety. We are looking for men who want to rebuild their lives and live in a happy safe environment.

Size of house/layout: Each house has 6 bedrooms and 4 bathrooms, when the house is full 2 men per room. We have a full kitchen and provide members with beds, pillows, sheets, cable television in room, wireless internet access. All kitchen needs, coffee, sugar, creamer laundry detergent bleach etc.

Handicap accessible? No

Fee structure: \$115 per week plus a \$230 deposit which can be paid over the course of 1 month. All bills included.

Philosophy: Our main objective at St. Maureen's Recovery House, is to provide a safe and peaceful place to live. A place to regain our self respect and dignity and to become productive members of society once again.

Structure:

All residents must obtain employment within 2 weeks of occupancy and if not employed...must be out of the house looking for work by 10:00 AM Monday-Friday.

Residents must be employed at least 28 hours per week.

All Residents are on an 11:00 PM curfew for the first 2 weeks of residency and will remain on curfew until deposit is paid-in-full.

Residents are not allowed out front without a shirt.

Zero tolerance for Violence or Threats of Violence.

Zero tolerance for Use of Alcohol or Drugs.

Programs/Activities:

12 Step meeting schedule: People from the house attend meetings nightly. We often car pool to meetings to ensure members of the house are getting out and meeting people in the sober community.

Internal- We have bi-weekly house meetings which all members are required to attend these meetings are where we talk about what is going well at the house and in each member's lives. We also offer counseling to members who feel that they would like to speak with someone outside of the house about continuing to stay sober.

External- People from the house attend meetings nightly we often car pool to meetings to ensure members of the house are getting out and meeting people in the sober community.
